## The President's Missive

I can't remember a time in my life when so many of us in America and around the globe were holding our breath as we counted the days left before Wednesday, January 20, 2021; The Inauguration of the 46<sup>th</sup> President of the United States of America, Joseph R. Biden, Jr. and Kamala Devi Harris, the 49<sup>th</sup> and first woman, first African American, and first Asian American Vice President. It was a glorious day even with the massive security and the Covid-19 protocols in place. I felt confident that the United States was back on track to heal the terrible divisions of the last four years as I listened to President Biden's Inaugural Address. He began with these words: "This is America's day. This is democracy's day. A day of history and hope. Of renewal and resolve. Through a crucible for the ages America has been tested anew and America has risen to the challenge. Today, we celebrate the triumph not of a candidate, but of a cause, the cause of democracy. The will of the people has been heard and the will of the people has been heeded. We have learned again that democracy is precious. Democracy is fragile. And at this hour, my friends, democracy has prevailed."

The inauguration lifted my spirit with so many inspiring words and fabulous vocal performances. Garth Brooks, a Republican, answering Biden's call for bipartisan unity, sang a beautiful, a cappella version of "Amazing Grace" and asked the audience to join him for the last verse. Jennifer Lopez sang an inspiring arrangement of Woody Guthrie's "This Land Is Your Land" and then segued into "America the Beautiful" shouting out in Spanish, "One nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all." But for me, Lady Gaga, the first performer, making an entrance in a dress only she could wear, brought us all together as Americans with her magnificent performance of "The Star Spangled Banner."

At the close of the ceremony, a 22 year old Harvard graduate and the first national youth poet laureate, Amanda Gorman, stepped up to the podium and stole the hearts of all who were lucky enough to hear her beautiful and powerfully crafted inaugural poem, "The Hill We Climb." She challenged us all in the first line of the poem by presenting us with a problem that Americans desperately need to resolve. "When the day comes, we ask ourselves, where can we find light in this never-ending shade?" Her five minute poem continued to remind us of the work we still must do to close the divide of our country "that is bruised but whole, benevolent but bold, fierce and free." She ended her piece with a powerful message, "The new dawn balloons as we free it. For there is always light, if only we're brave enough to see it. If only we're brave enough to be it."

I am so proud to be the president of the Brevard Federation of Teachers – Retired. Over these past four years, we have worked tirelessly together, regardless of our political differences, to stand with our BFT teachers as they waved signs and attended school board meetings to ensure that they would be given a fair and equitable contract, volunteered in schools, worked with Rita Hewett and Sheila Bollinger every year preparing and distributing bags of books and stuffed toys to every Pre-K, K, and 1<sup>st</sup> grader in every Title I school in Brevard County, supported their political parties and candidates by phone banking, post card writing, waving signs, and canvassing. They made masks to help keep people safe from Covid-19, provided grants and college scholarships for the children of BFT teachers entering their first year of college, contacted our members as part of our phone tree with surveys and wellness checks, attended fun and informative field trips, and listened to interesting and entertaining speakers at all our meetings. Individually, our members are active participants in groups such as the ACLU, League of Woman Voters, and numerous local church and environmental organizations.



I hate when a couple argues in public, and I missed the beginning and don't know whose side I'm on.


I don't mean to interrupt people. I just randomly remember things and get really excited.
