10 Questions on Hybrid

This week we asked Dr. Mullins to answer the 10 most pressing questions we received from members on Hybrid Learning.

- Can it be a classroom expectation that students have their cameras on at certain times? Yes
- Other than quarantine, should a brick and mortar student temporarily transition to E Learning? Possibly depending on the scenarios, if it is a 1 -3 day absence, the student will be just be doing makeup work or the Moving Forward materials, depending if it is the class or a student quarantine. If the student is going to be out for a longer time the parent would sign the agreement for eLearning and move to that platform.
- Can we limit students transferring to E Learning until they've been absent for at least two days? Students should not be transferring back and forth unless under a quarantine situation of more than 3 days.
- When E Learning students are working independently, can the teacher mute and/or turn off cameras? This would be situational, based upon the grade level, the task and level of support needed.
- If a parent or a student is being inappropriate on Zoom, can the teacher temporarily remove that parent or student from the Zoom? Teachers should be working directly with school-based administrators on situations of this nature.
- What online resources are available so that teachers can streamline instruction for online and brick and mortar students? All of the instructional materials, pacing guides and standard alignment materials are available to include the training developed by the Tech integrators to support online learners.
- Has the district looked into additional software for teachers such as <u>kamiapp.com</u>? No, I would
 encourage teachers to utilize the open office hours that the content specialist have developed to
 support teachers.
- Why are the teachers being asked to give their administrators teacher access to Google Classroom? Should administrators make changes to content and arrangement? It is an extra layer of support for teachers, in the event they are absent and various situations.
- Can school techs be responsible for assisting students/parents with tech issues? Everyone is helping parents to include the tech and administrators
- What determines being present for E Learners? At the secondary level? At the elementary level? Being present, should mirror what is going on in brick and mortar."
