2021 Florida Legislative Session Update

The Florida Legislative Session starts on March 2 this year. Knowing that during the committee weeks preceding the formal start of the session is when the bills are actually introduced and begin the process of hearings, I have been following numerous Education Bills that are detrimental for educators. I interviewed FEA President Andrew Spar about these bills on February 15th.

Senate Bill 78: This bill is a union busting bill that puts employers in charge of dues authorization.

Senate Bill 48: Expands the amount of money that private schools will be taking from the education budget with a massive expansion of vouchers.

Senate Bill 264: A bill regulating what university professors can teach.

Senate Bill 220: University Presidents will not be chosen in the sunshine, giving politicians a chance to award their friends with a high paying position.

Senate Bill 84: Eliminates the pension option for employees in the Florida Retirement System on July 1, 2022. Instead, all employees will be placed in the investment plan, thus depleting the FRS system!

One of the really bad bills being pushed this year is HB1, which prevents individuals from protesting. There are many parts of this bill that are unconstitutional, racist and hold-over elements from southern Reconstruction. I traveled to Tallahassee to speak against this Bill and FEA leader Rich Templin also spoke against this bill, but it is advancing.

I strongly urge all of you to sign up for the action alerts from FEA on the website and make as many calls as possible. The very future of our Unions and our Retirement Pension is at stake this year. We need your voice.
